Purpose of the trip was to assess the progress of the Hermel school for Syrian children refugees, spend time with the school staff in training and appreciation of their work, visit and evaluate local non-profit organizations as potential partners, and meet family and friends.

Hermel School - Students Engagement



All four classes have completed exams the week prior to our arrival and we participated in recognizing their test results.

One of the multiple objectives of this trip was to bring with us school supplies and teaching materials donated by our partners. We packed over 200 lbs of supplies and carried them as luggage to ensure immediate benefit avoiding shipping hassles and potential losses thru traditional shipping companies.

You see the smiles and enthusiasm of the students as they received the much needed items.

While at the school in Hermel, we planned for a day of training on teaching materials and equipment along with a visit to a nearby (20 miles away) school in operations for ten years serving the Syrian refugees in Zahleh.

From Baalbek, we continued to Barook, a mountainous region where a forest of the famous cedars of Lebanon exist garnished by snow on the ground.

As we started this journey with the Hermel school, we committed to partner with them for the current school year and evaluate at its end the next steps. The current school year ends at the end of June. Our trip to Lebanon provided us the opportunity to meet with local non profit organizations working with both Lebanese and Refugees (Syrian and Palestinian).

As the economic situation in Lebanon is worsening, we are considering other parts of Lebanon to partner with locals that have established humanitarian support through educational scholarships, and self-sufficient projects as an employment in the Services sector.
